IN JULY 2020, IN THE MIDST OF A GLOBAL PANDEMIC WITH DEVASTATING ECONOMIC AND SOCIAL CONSEQUENCES, THE DORIS DUKE CHARITABLE FOUNDATION ANNOUNCED A SOCIAL BOND OFFERING TO APPLY \$100 MILLION TO STRENGTHEN THE SECTORS THAT DDCF FUNDS. THE FOUNDATION BELIEVES THAT THE NONPROFIT SECTOR HAS BEEN SEVERELY HARMED BY THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC AND ITS ECONOMIC FALLOUT, AND THAT NONPROFIT ORGANIZATIONS WILL REQUIRE SUBSTANTIAL ADDITIONAL FINANCIAL RESOURCES TO CONTINUE TO CARRY OUT THEIR CHARITABLE MISSIONS. IN RESPONSE, THE FOUNDATION SEEKS TO SUBSTANTIALLY INCREASE ITS GRANTMAKING IN THE COMING YEARS TO MAKE GRANTS DIRECTED AT BUILDING RESILIENCE IN THE NONPROFIT SECTOR AND STABILIZING AND STRENGTHENING KEY NONPROFIT ORGANIZATIONS (THE "SPECIAL ALLOCATION GRANTS"). THE SPECIAL ALLOCATION GRANTS WILL BE MADE IN ADDITION TO THE FOUNDATION'S NORMAL GRANTMAKING. THE NET PROCEEDS OF THE BONDS ARE EXPECTED TO BE USED TO PROVIDE GRANT FUNDING FOR SPECIAL ALLOCATION GRANTS. THESE WILL BE GRANTS OVER AND ABOVE THE FOUNDATION'S NORMAL GRANTMAKING TO ORGANIZATIONS, PROJECTS, AND PROGRAMS MEETING THE FOUNDATION'S GRANTMAKING EVALUATION CRITERIA OR AS INVESTMENTS CONSISTENT WITH ITS PROGRAM-RELATED INVESTMENT ("PRI") PROCESS.

THE FOUNDATION'S TARGET POPULATION OF EXISTING AND PROSPECTIVE GRANTEE AND PRI PARTNERS ARE LARGELY DEPENDENT ON PHILANTHROPIC FUNDING AND THUS ARE PARTICULARLY VULNERABLE TO OPERATIONAL, EMPLOYMENT, AND MISSION DISRUPTION AS A RESULT OF THE WIDER ECONOMIC SLOWDOWN CAUSED BY COVID-19 CONTROL MEASURES. THE AFRICAN HEALTH INITIATIVE IS A SPECIAL INITIATIVE LAUNCHED IN 2007 BY THE DORIS DUKE CHARITABLE FOUNDATION TO STRENGTHEN HEALTH SYSTEMS IN SUB-SAHARAN AFRICA BY SUPPORTING PARTNERSHIPS AND LARGE-SCALE MODELS OF CARE THAT LINK IMPLEMENTATION RESEARCH AND WORKFORCE TRAINING DIRECTLY TO THE DELIVERY OF INTEGRATED PRIMARY HEALTHCARE.

IN THE AFRICAN HEALTH INITIATIVE'S FIRST PHASE, THE FOUNDATION AWARDED FOUR GRANTS TO PILOT A VARIETY OF HEALTH SYSTEMS STRENGTHENING INTERVENTIONS IN GHANA, MOZAMBIQUE, RWANDA, TANZANIA AND ZAMBIA. THOUGH NOT ALL ACTIVITIES HAD THE DESIRED IMPACT, SEVERAL RESULTED IN MEASURABLE IMPROVEMENTS TO HEALTH SYSTEM PERFORMANCE. THE ENCOURAGING RESULTS PROMPTED A FOLLOW-UP PHASE, WITH THE DORIS DUKE CHARITABLE FOUNDATION SUPPORTING PARTNERSHIPS IN ETHIOPIA, GHANA AND MOZAMBIQUE TO REPLICATE AND SCALE UP MEASURES THAT HAD PROVEN SUCCESSFUL IN THE EARLIER PHASE.

MOST OF THE WORK FUNDED THROUGH THE AFRICAN HEALTH INITIATIVE WILL END IN 2023, AND THE LAST PROJECT IS SET TO CONCLUDE IN 2024. THOUGH THE FUNDING HAS COME TO AN END, THE WORK AND PARTNERSHIPS ESTABLISHED IN EACH COUNTRY WILL CONTINUE.

TYPICALLY, THIS RESEARCH LEADS TO THE DEVELOPMENT OF A GRANT INITIATIVE, WHICH SUPPORTS A SET OF RELATED GRANTS THAT ADVANCE A SPECIFIC GOAL OR OBJECTIVE. ONCE AN INITIATIVE IS DEVELOPED, GRANTS ARE AWARDED IN A VARIETY OF WAYS, INCLUDING FOUNDATION-INITIATED INVITATIONS TO APPLY, REGRANTING COMPETITIONS THAT ARE ADMINISTERED BY SERVICE ORGANIZATIONS AND COMPETITIONS THAT ARE RUN USING REQUEST-FOR-PROPOSAL PROCESSES. PRIOR TO SUBMITTING A LETTER OF INQUIRY, INTERESTED APPLICANTS ARE STRONGLY ENCOURAGED TO REVIEW THE FOUNDATION'S WEBSITE AND THE GRANTMAKING PROCESSES FOR THE APPROPRIATE PROGRAM TO DETERMINE THE POTENTIAL FIT OF THEIR PROJECT WITH THE PROGRAM'S STRATEGIES: PERFORMING ARTS, MEDICAL RESEARCH, ENVIRONMENT, CHILD WELL-BEING.
