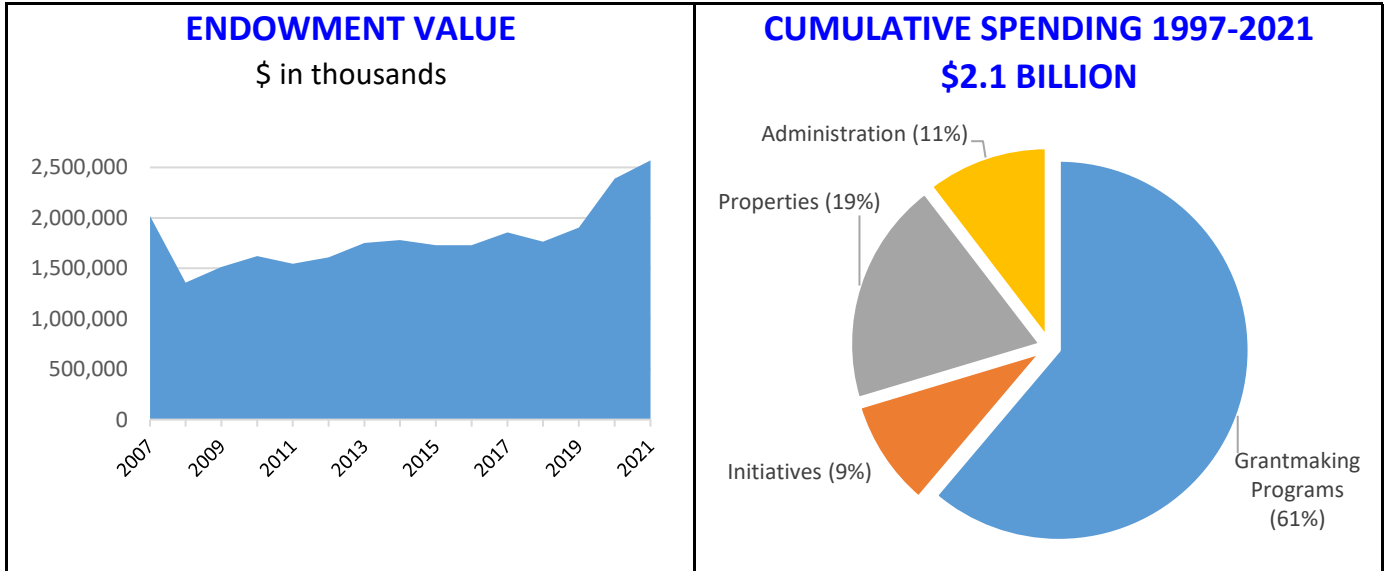
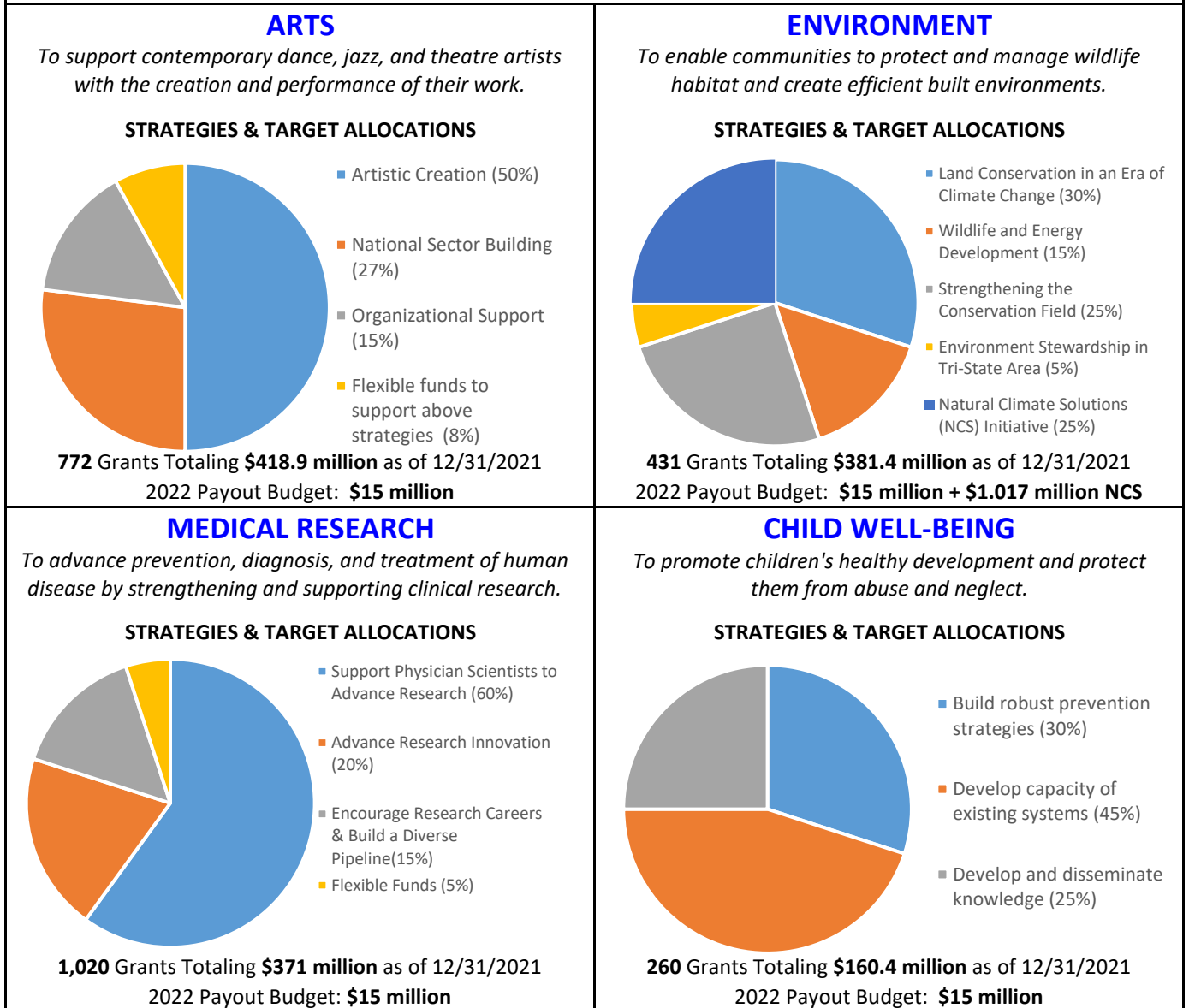

GRANTMAKING PROGRAMS*



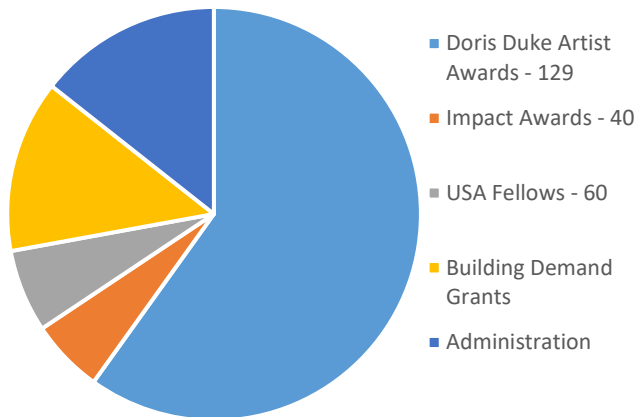

PERFORMING ARTISTS INITIATIVE

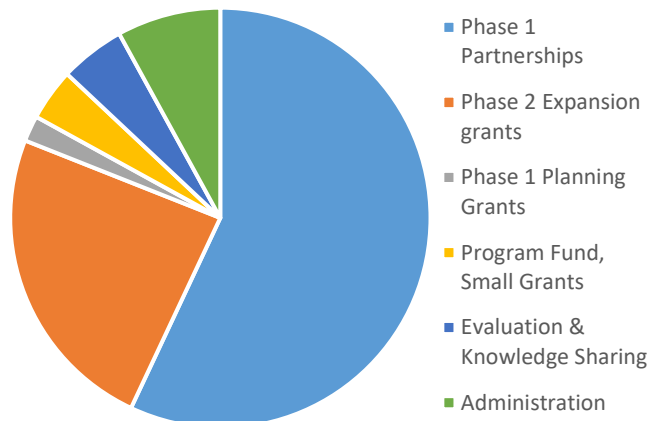
To support artists through individual grants and projects to build demand for the performing arts.

Open to the public: 2002

- Be recognized in Hawaii as the locus of educational programs and expertise on Islamic arts and cultures
- Build credibility as an emerging national center for Islamic arts and cultures
- Steward Shangri La site, architecture and collections

2022 Budgeted Spending (operating and capital):

\$6.1 million

BUILDING BRIDGES PROGRAM

To advance relationships and increase understanding between Muslims and non-Muslim communities for mutual well-being.

256 Grants Totaling \$34.5 million as of 12/31/2021

2022 Payout Budget: **\$4 million**

DUKE FARMS FOUNDATION

Hillsborough, New Jersey

To be a model of environmental stewardship and inspire visitors to become more informed stewards of the land.

Re-opened to the public in May 2012 after \$45 million capital project. Programmatic themes include:

- Wildlife ecology
- Agriculture & horticulture
- Sustainability
- Cultural heritage
